

# Centralia College Creates Lactation Room for Nursing Mothers

Centralia College recently opened a lactation room to provide students and employees who are nursing a private space to feed their infants.

The space, located in Washington Hall Room 204, has a mini-refrigerator, seating, side table and electrical outlets for breast pumps.

A card reader was installed that unlocks the door using ID cards of scheduled users to ensure privacy.

The room, formerly a private office, was converted after a student asked for a private place to nurse her baby. She asked the college to comply with Title IX requirements. It opened last quarter, and a few breastfeeding mothers have already used the area.

"We have had some positive feedback on the creation of the room and providing a space and support for nursing and lactating mothers," Julie Ledford, vice president of Human Resources and Legal Affairs, said in a press release.
